Miller, of lawful age, being duly sworn according to law, upon their oaths do depose and say each for himself and not one for the other, that at a meeting and election held at the Teel Store Building, in Kendall, Oklahoma, the 23rd day of October, 1911, there were at nine o'clock A.M. of said day and at said place duly and legally elected inspectors of an election on the question of the incorporation of the territory to be embraced and known as Kendall, Oklahoma, by the electors then and there assembled in accordance with an order and notice thereof heretofore made and issued on the 7th day of October, 1911.

Now on this 6th day of November, 1911, the same being a day of the regular November, 1911, meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, this matter came on for hearing on the report of the inspectors of election on the question of incorporating the town of Kendall, said election having been held on the 23rd day of October, 1911, in accordance with and in pursuance of an order of the Board made herein on the 7th day of October, 1911.

And said inspectors, H. P. Knepper, Dalton Lain and J. D. Miller, having made and filed their report herein showing that such election was held at the time and place specified in the order of this Board made as above set out, to-wit: at the Teel Store Building in Kendall, Oklahoma, on the 23rd day of October, 1911, between the hours of nine o'clock A.M. and four o'clock P.M. of said day.

And the Board finds from said report and other affidavits and evidence, on file in the office of the County Clerk of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and

That the report of said election inspectors above named is in due legal and proper form and is properly verified as required by law;

That due legal and proper notice of such election was given as by law and the order of this Board required and that all the requirements of the laws of Oklahoma, and the orders of this Board, relative to said election and the conduct thereof have been fully complied with; that the notice above referred to was published in the Tulsa Daily Democrat as by law required and was posted by copies, ten in number, in the most public places in the territory to be embraced in said incorporation;

That said election on the question of incorporating said Town of Kendall as above set out, was legally called, legally conducted and was a legal election in all repsects and particulars upon the question of the incorporation of said town of Kendall;

The Board further finds that at said election and meeting fortyothree qualified voters attended and voted on said question and that ballots bearing the words "For Incorporation Yes" were voted by forty-one of said voters and that ballots bearing the words "For Incorporation No" were voted by two of said votefs, whereby it appears and the Board so finds that a majority of thirty-nine persons who are qualified voters within said territory to be embraced in said incorporation have voted in favor of incorporation, and the Board fins that a majority of the qualified voters of said territory have voted in favor of incorporating said territory into a town to be known as KENDALL, OKLAHOMA.
