## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, a demand has been made by the citizens of Osage County and surrounding counties that Oklahoma State Highway No. 20 be extended West and North from Skiatook over Osage County Highway No. 22 for a distance of Seventy-Three miles through the cities of Hominy and Fairfax to a junction with U.3. Highway N:. 60 twelve miles west of the town of Burbank, and.

WHEREAS, no East and West Oklahoma State Highway crosses the southern part of Osage County, and

WHEREAS, the demand and necessity for such a road is very great and would be of great value and benefit to this section of the State of Oklahoma, and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commissioners are the only ones who have the legal power to designate, construct, mark and maintain State Highways.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oklahoma State Highway Commission is hereby petitioned by this Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County in regular session this 15th day of April, 1935, to designate and mark thus section of road as an extension of Oklahoma State Highway No. 20 and we further respectfully request that any portion or portions of this route not now a part of the Federal Aid System be added thereto.

The County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, wish to make this statement regarding Mike Anderson's case.

About the 23rd day of last August the Amderson family appeared in Tulsa County and asked for assistance for Mrs. Anderson who was expecting a baby within a short time. The Welfare Department made an effort to return this family to Greer County, their legal mesidence, and Mr. Anderson refused to return at that time daiming that Mrs. Anderson was unable to travel, but did promise that as soon as Mrs. Anderson was able they would gladly return to Greer County. After a thorough investigation by the Welfare Department of Tulsa County and the County Physician, it was found that it was an emergency case and Tulsa County agreed to take care of Mrs. Anderson and the family until her condition would permit their return to Greer County. After the baby arrived and some little time thereafter the Publis Health nurse and the County Physician made a report to the Welfare Department that Mrs. Anderson was able to travel, and Mrs.
