

A motion was made by W. L. North and seconded by Ed Dalton that the County assessor be authorized and instructed to make the following changes on the tax rolls from 1915 to 1918 inclusive, changing the description "The part of the Southeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southwest quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section twelve (12) township Nineteen (19) North, Range twelve (12) East lying south of the Seig addition West of the Midland Valley Right of way, to read as follows:

"Commencing at the southwest corner of the Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southwest quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section twelve (12), township nineteen (19) North, Range Twelve (12) east, I. M., extending North and west along the west line thereof four hundred and forty (440) feet thence east along the north line of lots Eleven (11) in Block One (1) and lot twelve (12) in block Three (3) of the Seig addition to the City of Tulsa as shown by the plat filed March 13th, 1909 and recorded in Plat Book No. One (1) Page Sixteen (16) thereof, a distance of four hundred fifty five and one half (455 $\frac{1}{2}$) feet more or less, to the west line of the right of way of the Midland Valley Rail Road Company, thence in a southerly course along the west line of said tight-of-way to the south line of said section, thence west along the south line of said section to the place of beginning, said tract including Lot eleven (11) in Block One (1) All of Block Two (2) and lots twelve (12) to Nineteen both inclusive in Block (3) of the said Seig addition together with the vacated streets and alleys within said boundaries."

The County Engineer's annual Financial Report of work done on the Tulsa County Road system from July 1st, 1919, to June 30th, 1920, inclusive, was filed with and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

The appointment of E. W. Reynolds as Deputy Sheriff was filed with and approved by the Board, also the reports of the county clerks division for the months of December, January, February, March, April May and June, said report being from November 30th, 1919, to July 1st, 1920, were filed and approved a like action being taken on the report of the County Clerk, Register of Deeds Department for the month of June, 1920, and the financial statement of the Tulsa County Home from May 27th to June 30th was filed and approved by the Board.

The official bond of E. I. Saddler as Justice of the Peace in the amount of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars was filed and approved by the Board.

Affidavits of erroneous assessment made by Laura Courtney nee Dyle, Walter Phillips, Artie Smith, C. H. Lamb, J. V. Baker and L. E. Z. Aaronson were ordered stricken from the tax rolls, and the latter, viz., L. E. Z. Aaronson was ordered assessed as requested.

Upon Motion of W. L. North the Board adjourned to meet Wednesday July 7th, 1920.

WEDNESDAY JULY 7th, 1920.

Pursuant to adjournment the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma met with all members present, in the office of the County Clerk at the hour of 9 o'clock A. M. on July 7th, 1920.

The appointment of a County Physician was the first business coming before the Board. Dr. Mont V. Stanley having filed resignation on July 6th, 1920, and on motion of W. L. North seconded by F. M. Wooden, Dr. J. F. Capps was appointed County and Jail physician to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of the said Dr. Mont V. Stanley. Motion prevailed.

A motion was made by W. L. North and seconded by F. M. Wooden that the Tulsa Camera and Record Company be instructed to discontinue the work of making the permanent records of Tulsa County, now in progress in the Recording division of the county Clerk's office and immediately remove said plant from the said office. the vote thereon being as follows.

The claim of the said company in the amount of \$2412.00 for services rendered in the making of the said records of Tulsa County by the said Tulsa Camera Record Company was disallowed by the Board.

A motion was made by Ed Dalton and seconded by W. L. North that W. R. Wilson be appointed constable of District No. Eleven (11) Sand Springs. Motion prevailed.

A motion was made by W. L. North and seconded by Ed Dalton that Deputy State Examiner and Inspector, Ed O. Cassidy, be and he is hereby requested to assist and supervise in the preparing the budgets for the County of Tulsa and townships for the fiscal year 1920-1921, and also act as Examiner and Inspector for the said year for the Tulsa County Excise Board.
