Among the available assets credited on the balance sheet is an item of \$3140.77 due from succeeding Court Clerk, John D. Porter by reason of tverpayments made to Porter on his report of balances in cases as of January 4th, 1919. In the cases representing the balances on thatdate, no balances existed, or if any balances existed such balances were in an amount less than reported and paid to the succeeding Court Clerk. On that date, to-wit, January 6th, 1919, the succeeding clerk was in possession of the cash thus overpaid to him, and on that date said overpayments could have been refunded to the retiring clerk and a correct report made reflecting the correct balances in all cases and said amount would then have been credited to the proper cases. An investigation made by me at the close of the audit for the purpose of ascertaining the amount of cash on hand representing such erroneous overpayments discloses the fact that in many instances the succeeding Court Clerk, John D. Porter, accepting such balances as reported to him by the retiring Court Clerk B. F. Ingraham, as correct has disbursed against the same, and hence much of the amount so overpaid cannot now be considered as available against thebalances owing January 6th, 1919 as shown on the general balance sheet.

In order to determine the exact amount that thr retiring clerk shall be called upon to make good it will be necessary to make a supple, emtal audit of the succeeding Court Clerk's records to determine the amount, if any, that he how has on hand of the amount over paid to him on the final report of the returing clerk.

And in making such supplemental audit it will practically be no more expense to the county to make a complete audit of the Court Clerk from January 6th, 1919, to June 30th, m1920, as the supple, emtal audit will of necessity have to cover that period.

I have taken this matter up with the State Examiner and Inspector and the above report and recommendations are concurred in by him.
