

COMMISSIONERS JOURNAL, TULSA COUNTY, OKLA.

Warden Co., Oklahoma City

March 23rd, 1912.

A strip of ground 49.5 feet wide, baing 24.75 feet each side of the following described center line:

Starting at the northeast corner of Section twenty-two (22), Township nineteen (19) north, Range twelve (12) east, Tulsa County, Oklahoma; thence west along north line of section twenty-two (22) aforesaid, a distance of 213.8 feet to the St. Louis & San Francisco Railroad Company's easterly right of way line; thence southerly along aforesaid right of way line and making an angle of 81 degrees, no minutes, to the left with last described course, a distance of 780 feet; thence westerly at right angles to last described course, a distance of 49.5 feet for a point of beginning; thence continuing on last described course a distance of 190.5 feet; thence southerly at right angles to last-described course a distance of 620 feet to the south line of the northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section twenty-two (22) aforesaid; said strip of ground contains 0.92 of an acre.
