R E S O L U T I O N
DESIGNATING ADDITIONAL COUNTY HIGHWAY.

WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 44 of the Extraordinary Session of the Ninth Oklahoma Legislature provides, among other things, for the designation of County Highways.

AND, WHEREAS, it is considered to be to the best interest of Tulsa County that a certain section of road be made a part of the County Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved that the section lines

"Between Sections Twenty One (21) and Twenty Eight (28)
Between Sections Twenty Two (22) and Twenty Seven (27)
Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Eleven (11) East"

be and the same is hereby designated as a County Highway.

All voting in the affirmative, motion was declared carried and Resolution adopted.

In the matter of the Petition of the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company the following ORDER was made:

O R D E R

NOW, on this the 7th. day of April, 1930, the matter of the Petition of the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company for permission to break paving along certain highway in said County and State came up before the Board of County Commissioners of said County for hearing, and it appearing to the Board and each of the Commissioners thereof, that it was just that the said Southwestern Bell Telephone Company be permitted to cut paving as designated by description filed by said Company, which is as follows, to-wit:

Across Sheridan Road 22' South of Frisco Crossing. Range 13,
East, Township 20, South $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 26. Cut to lie 18" wide
and across pavement.

AND, it further appearing from the petition herein that said cut will be made so as not to interfere with any of the rights of the general public in the uses of said highway; and will be constructed in accordance with all rules of the County Commissioners and the laws of the State of Oklahoma governing same.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED by the Board of County Commissioners of said County that permission be granted and the same is hereby granted to Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, its successors and assigns, to use as much of the highways as above designated.

R E S O L U T I O N

NOW, On this 7th. day of April, 1930, there having been offers of certain coal mining interests to lease the coal underlying the following described property in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, belonging to said Tulsa County, to-wit:

The Southeast Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) and the East Half
(E $\frac{1}{2}$) of the Southwest Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section
Nine (9), Township Nineteen (19) North, Range
Thirteen (13) East.

and the matter coming up for general discussion and it appearing the county may derive a revenue therefrom, and that said coal, if any, underlying said lands should be leased.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, by the County Commissioners, sitting in regular session that O G Weaver, County Clerk be and he is hereby directed to advertise as provided by law that Tulsa County through its Board of County Commissioners will lease the coal underlying said lands to the highest bidder upon the following terms:

1. That Lessee shall have no right to use the surface of said lands other than for telephone, telegraph, water and sewer, electric lines and drill holes used in connection with mining operations.

2. For a term not to exceed ten (10) years, or as long thereafter as coal remains in merchantable quantities.
