In addition to the above the Extension Division of the A. and M. College agrees to extend to all agents the free use of the mails in the sending of agricultural materials, to furnish the agents necessary stationery, instructions and printed bulletins for the use of farmers in the county, both from the college and from the United States Department of Agriculture.

The Extension Division of the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical College will supervise the work of these agents, carefully looking after the same to see that the work is done efficiently and in a manner to be of the largest possible benefit to the people of the County.

The said A. and M. College likewise agrees to send to the county special representatives to assist these agents on special tasks, and to hold educational meetings for the benefit of farmers and to assist in every possible way in making the work in the county effective.

The agent's salaries will be payable on or after the first of each month on certificate from the agents that the work has been duly performed.

In the event any agent proves to be incompetent to carry on a program of extension work satisfactory to the farm people of said county and to the Extension Division of the A. and M. College, the County Commissioners and the Extension Division shall mutually agree upon the release of such agent and upon the appointment of a satisfactory successor to continue the work to the completion of the contract in the same manner as was originally provided.

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, is the owner of the following described real premises situated in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, to-wit:

Lots Five (5) and Six (6), Block Twelve (12),
Berry Addition to the City of Tulsa, Tulsa County,
Oklahoma, according to the recorded plat thereof,

and,

WHEREAS, said property is unused by said County and is not needed for Court House or jail or any other purposes for said County, and

WHEREAS, there is levied against this property paving assessments in two separate paving districts which are delinquent in payment, and it is for the best interest for said County make sale thereof.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that said property be sold to the highest bidder for cash in the manner provided by law.

Upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was declared carried and Resolution adopted as read.
