- #14 (amend to read) That no Building Permit shall be issued until the requirements of Section 260 of the Zoning Code have been satisfied, including the incorporation within the restrictive covenants of approval, making the County of Tulsa beneficiary to said covenants. Further, no Building Permit shall be issued until said permit shall have been approved by the Board of County Commissioners in public hearing and upon its review and approval of engineering plans for any lagoons to be constructed as a part of this PUD development.
