

after discussing the responsibilities of the position. They agreed they would work diligently to fill the position as soon as possible.

Wilson discussed a proposal by Pre-Trial Release to implement day reporting, JURIS monitoring, electronic monitoring and absconder tracking. He said a letter of support would be forthcoming from the judges in addition to a revised City of Tulsa agreement relating to the City/DVIS Links Grant funding in the amount of \$54,000.00. Rines explained that JURIS is a specific type of monitor designed primarily to protect victims of domestic violence. This monitoring system includes an ankle monitor, a wrist bracelet, and two sets of boxes that hook to telephone lines to pinpoint the exact location of a perpetrator 24 hours a day. If they get within a set radius of the victim, a call is automatically placed to 911. Wilson explained that it takes weeks on the average for domestic violence charges to be adjudicated and another 2 weeks before the suspected perpetrator reports to DVIS. This program is designed to eliminate the 9 week period during which the victim may be in danger. The suspected perpetrators would voluntarily report to DVIS before going to court. They would be monitored and would receive counseling. Those who are unemployed would be required to seek employment two days a week and perform community service three days a week to promote pro-social behavior. The judges will develop the rules and guidelines for participation in the program. The Board requested Edwards work with Wilson/Rines to prepare additional information before the proposal is presented to the TCCJAs Budget and Finance Committee. The additional information should include: Letter from Chief Ron Palmer, Tulsa Police Department, indicating support of the program and advising that a policy will be in place to respond immediately to calls; letter from DVIS advising they have adequate staffing in place to handle the additional clients this program will generate; improved explanation of the projected savings to be generated by this program; justification of the need for three counselors (what they will be doing, what case load each is expected to handle, and why three will be needed); and measurable goals/objectives. Motion was made by Dick, seconded by Selph to approve the concept outlined in Wilsons June 29 proposal, subject to the data and documents being received as shown immediately above. Upon roll call: Selph, yes; Collins, yes; Dick, yes. Motion carried.

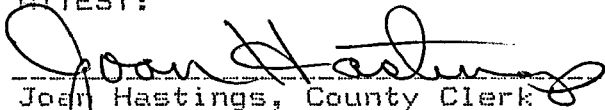
