Pursuant to recess heretofore taken, the Board of County Commissioners re-convened at the hour of 2:00 o'clock P.M., with all members present: John H. Miller, Chairman; J. B. Gray and Harry L. Hopkins, Members. Andy Stokes, County Clerk.

Chairman Miller presiding, the following business was transacted:

Reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with and there being no objection to the same they were ordered to stand approved.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR EXTENSION WORK
BETWEEN

TULSA COUNTY AND THE EXTENSION DIVISION OF THE OKLAHOMA
AGRICULTURAL AND MECHANICAL COLLEGE COOPERATING WITH
THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

OBJECT:

For the purpose of assisting farmers and farm families of Tulsa County with the many problems of farming, home making, and community life, the Extension Division of the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical College and the Board of County Commissioners of said county acting under authority of law, enter into this contract for carrying on cooperative demonstration work in agriculture and home economics, including 4-H club work in Tulsa County during the year beginning July 1, 1935 and ending June 30, 1936.

METHOD OF
PROCEDURE

For the objects expressed above, the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical College, cooperating with the United States Department, shall select the agent or agents to be employed, such persons to be well qualified to fill these positions by training, education and experience, who shall be satisfactory to the Commissioners of said County.

COUNTY FUNDS AND
EQUIPMENT

The County Commissioners agree to pay One Hundred Fifteen Dollars (\$115.00) per month on the salary of a County Agricultural Agent, and and Sixty-Six and 66/100 Dollars (\$66.66) per month on a salary of a County Home Demonstration Agent for a period of Twelve (12) months, beginning July 1, 1935. The County Commissioners further agree to furnish an office and to appropriate the following amounts to apply on the expenses of the County Agent \$1000; for the County Home Demonstration Agent \$600.00; for Assistant County Agent \$_____; for salary or expenses of a Secretary \$1500.00; for salary or expenses of a Negro Woman Agent \$_____; the expenses to be paid monthly and the total amount paid in one month not to exceed the proportionate part of the year the agent has worked.

COLLEGE FUNDS
AND EQUIPMENT

In addition to the funds furnished by the County, the Extension Division of the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical College, co-operating with the United States Department of Agriculture, will pay One Hundred Ten Dollars (\$110.00) per month on the salary of the County Agricultural Agent, and will pay One Hundred Ten Dollars (\$110.00) per month on the salary of the Home Demonstration Agent, also will pay _____ Dollars (\$) per month on the salary of an Assistant Agent; also will pay _____ Dollars (\$) on the salary of a Negro County Agent, and _____ Dollars (\$) on the salary of a Negro Woman Agent. The Extension Division of the A. and M. College also agrees to furnish all agents employed with the franking privilege for the free use of the mails in sending of agricultural publications in the county, to furnish the agents necessary stationery, instructions and printed bulletins for the use of farmers in the county, both from the College and from the United States Department of Agriculture.
