The Board of County Commissioners met in the District Court room, Division No. 2, at the hour of 11:05 o'clock A .M., and the District Court convened for the special purpose of administering the Oaths of Office to the new Board of County Commissioners. The new members, J. B. Gray, Ralsa F. Morley and Curtis Greer were sworn in by Judge Oras A. Shaw at the hour of 11:05 o'clock A.M. All members being qualified as required by law, the District Court recessed and the court room turned over to the Commission for their first regular meeting.

The first business coming on for consideration of the Board was the appointment of a Chairman.

Motion by Commissioner Morley, that J. B. Gray be appointed Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners for the year beginning July, 1941 and ending July, 1942. Motion seconded by Commissioner Greer, and upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was declared carried.

J. G. Gray, Chairman presiding, the following business was transacted.

Motion by Commissioner Morley, that the amount of the County Treasurer's bond be fixed at \$100,000. / Motion seconded by Commissioner Greer, and Upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

Motion by Commissioner Morley, that the bond filed by Joe T. Parkinson, County Treasurer, in the amount of \$100,000 and made by the Maryland Casualty Company, be and the same is hereby approved. Motion seconded by Commissioner Greer, and upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.
