WHEREAS, it is considered to be to the best interests of Tulsa County to construct certain pavement.

AND, WHEREAS, the law requires that said pavement be constructed under contract

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the County Engineer be and he is hereby directed to prepare plans and specifications and to advertise for bids for the paving of Two (2) Miles of the County Highway on Forty First Street, same being the section lines between Sections 19 30, 20-29, Township 19 North, Range 13 East.

The vote on the motion to adopt the resolution was in the affirmative, and said resolution was adopted as read.

 The following resolution was introduced by Mr.North, who moved its adoption and which was seconded by Mr.Hedgecock, and declared adopted:

WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 44, of the Extraordinary Session of the Ninth Oklahoma Legislature provides, among other things, for the designation of County Highways.

AND, WHEREAS, it is deemed to be to the best interests of Tulsa County that a County Highway be designated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Section line between Sections 26-27, and 34-35, T 19 N., R 11 E., be designated as a County Highway.

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Miles Two (2), and Three (3) of Section "A2" be abandoned as a County Highway.

 In the matter of the petition of the Oklahoma Natural Gas Corporation in which they ask permission to lay pipe lines under, through and across certain highways, the following order was made:

NOW, On this the 30th. day of January, 1928, the matter of the Petition of Oklahoma Natural Gas Corporation for permission to lay a pipe line under, through and across certain highways in said County and State came up before the Board of County Commissioners of said County for hearing, and it appearing to the Board and each of the Commissioners thereof, that it was just that the said Oklahoma Natural Gas Corporation be permitted to use as much of the highways as designated by plat filed by said corporation, and according to said description, which is as follows, to-wit:

A proposed six inch low pressure gas pipe line on Apache Street, Tulsa, Oklahoma, and along the North side thereof, from Frankfort Avenue on the West to a point opposite Lot 7, Block 1, Elgindale Addition, (which point is just East of Greenwood Avenue) on the
