Motion by Commission Gray, that O. J. Moyer, be and he is hereby appointed Farm Agent of Tulsa County. Motion seconded by Commissioner Morley, and upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

Motion by Commissioner Gray, that Clarence A. Wann, be and he is hereby appointed Assistant County Farm Agent; that Lenna M. Sawyer, be and she is hereby appointed Demonstration Agent, and that Ethel Kinney, be and she is hereby appointed Stenographer in the County Farm Agent department. Motion seconded by Commissioner Greer, and upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

Mr. Gray: In connection with the appointment of a Board of Control by the outgoing County Commissioners, I do not think they had the legal right to appoint this Board to rule and govern this hospital, and I, therefore, move that the hospital be closed and that such property now being used by the negro Municipal Hospital be turned backed to the City where it belongs and that the sick patients be transferred to the St. Johns Hospital. Mr. Morley: I have always stood for the transfer of this property back to the city and I second the motion. Upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

Motion by Commissioner Gray, that Drs. B. A. Waynes and W. T. Napier, be and they are hereby appointed Assistant County Physicians in the Negro section of Tulsa County. Motion seconded by Commissioner Morley, and upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

Motion by Commissioner Morley, that Willie Ward, be and she is hereby appointed case worker and investigator in the Negro section of Tulsa County to work under the Negro doctors. Upon roll call, the following vote was taken: Gray, Aye; Greer, No; Morley, Aye. Motion carried.
