Gentlemen:

The County Commissioners at a regular session desire to carry out the resolution that was adopted in the formation of the Clinic and signed by G. H. Shepard and Ralsa F. Morley. This was done at the urgent request of the Tulsa Medical Society. The resolution was in part as follows:

"The Tulsa County Medical Society will recommend the names of three suitable doctors to the Board of County Commissioners for their consideration for appointment as County Physician and Supervisor of the County Clinic. If the County Commissioners are unable to agree on any of the three doctors recommended, then the Tulsa County Medical Society will recommend three other men and so on until a suitable physician has been appointed as County Physician".

"*****The Assistant County Physician will be selected in the same manner as provided for the selection of the County Physician".

We, as County Commissioners, urgently request you to immediately file with the County Commissioners three recommendations for both County Physician and Assistant County Physician. We ask that this action be taken at once as the work of the Commissioners and the Clinic is being held up pending this.

At a later date when another request was presented and when the clinic was in danger the resolution said three or more recommendations for the County Physician and Assistant County Physician.
