Pursuant to recess heretofore taken, the Board of County Commissioners reconvened at the hour of 9:00 o'clock A.M., with all members present: J. B. Gray, Chairman; Ralsa F. Morley and Curtis Greer, members. Andy Stokes, County Clerk.

J. B. Gray, Chairman presiding, the following business was transacted.

Motion by Commissioner Greer, that A. Garland Marrs, Sheriff, be authorized to employ R. W. Brooks as of July 15th, 1941, at a salary of \$175.00 per month and to reinstate L. W. Bewley at a salary of \$175.00 per month. Motion seconded by Commissioner Morley, and upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

Motion by Commissioner Greer, that the County Commissioners ask the Board of Control recently appointed by the outgoing County Commissioners to tender their resignations to the County Commissioners for the sake of harmony, as we feel that after they consider it they will send it in and give the Commissioners a chance to re-open the colored municipal hospital for the benefit of the people in that district. Motion seconded by Commissioner Morley, and upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.
