neighborhood representatives from the area immediately west of downtown have approached INCOG staff with a concept to close and reconfigure some streets near and into downtown Tulsa. Staff is in the process of refining the preliminary concept, as well as some alternatives. Because it involves the area west of the proposed new jail site and Brady Avenue, which could be an important route to the jail, they felt it was important to bring this information to the Board. The request by the neighborhood (District 10) is to close Archer. The information presented today was to update the Commissioners on some of the changes that will need to take place in the future. Selph stressed that the Board doesn't want to do anything without having full input from the neighborhood associations. Harris added that the City of Tulsa will be the primary authority and will have final say. The Board assured Taylor and Fitts that any property that Tulsa County acquires for the new jail facility will be maintained by Tulsa County.

Carr presented an update on the FY-95 Tulsa County budget. The following documents were presented to the Board: 1) Estimate of Jail Taxes and Recovery of Expenses, 2) Recommendation General Fund Changes (October 1995), 3) Items in the General Fund Budget Relating to Jail Operations, and 4) Estimate of Jail Taxes and Recovery of Expenses. Harris stated this was good information but premature. He added that the Budget Board needs to be briefed on the above information.

The meeting adjourned at 10:55 a.m.
