

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that said roads are hereby declared as State Highways, and that the County Engineer be instructed to indicate the same upon the Official State Highways Map of Tulsa County, which latter named road however, subject to revised location by the County Engineer in order to eliminate certain objectionable grades in event the same is desirable from an engineering stand point; that the County Engineer designate said roads by letter or number, dividing the same into sections, and file a copy of such amended map with the State Department of Highways.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County Engineer furnish one or more copies of this Resolution to the State Highway Department, and the said State Highway Department are hereby respectfully requested to approve the same, and this Board does so recommend.

Pursuant to call, the Board of County Commissioners met in special session, on Wednesday, April 25th. 1923, at the hour of Three o'clock P.M., with the following members present: Ira Short, Member, F. M. Wooden, Member and O. G. Weaver, Secretary, Ex-officio Secretary. Geo. E. Gilmore, Chairman, Absent.

The following Resolution was introduced by F. M. Wooden, who moved its adoption and the motion to adopt was duly seconded by Ira Short, and the resolution was ordered read:

#### R E S O L U T I O N.

WHEREAS, Philip J. Kramer did, on the 16th. day of February, 1923, file an application in which this Board is requested to strike from the Assessment rolls of Frye Drainage District No. \_\_\_\_\_ all assessments both for the payment of bonds and maintenance, together with penalties for the years 1910 - 1912 to 1918, inclusive, and to cancel the sales as shown by the tax rolls and records in the office of the County Clerk of Tulsa County, for the years 1913 to 1918, inclusive, against the following described real estate in the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

The Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of the Northeast Quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Thirty Five (35), Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Thirteen (13) East

for the reason that the said real property, during the years above mentioned, was the allotment of Sallie Morrison, a Citizen of the Creek Nation, enrolled as a half blood, Roll No. 857, as her Homestead, and was restricted land, and not subject to alienation, taxation or assessment of a general or special nature.

WHEREAS, There has been filed before this Board a Journal Entry of the Judgment rendered in the District Court of Tulsa County, Case No. 22163, and styled Minnie Chisholm a minor, by C. S. Hailey, her Guardian, et al, Plaintiffs, vs Wayne L. Dickey, County Treasurer of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, Defendant.

WHEREAS, said judgment as rendered by the Court holds that the restricted Indian land of incompetent Indians is not subject to taxation, and
