## CONTRACT.

THIS AGREEMENT, Made this 19 day of April, between Tulsa County, Oklahoma, by the Board of County Commissioners, hereinafter called the party of the first part, and A.C. BANCROFT of Tulsa, Oklahoma, his heirs, successors and assigns, party of the second part hereinafter called the Contractor.

WITNESSETH: That the Contractor for and in consideration of the payment, or payments, herein specified and agreed to by the party of the first part, hereby covenants and agrees to furnish and deliverall the materials and to perform all the work and labor in the construction of the following bridges:

One Twenty (20) Foot Span, Twenty Four (24) Foot Roadway over Willow Springs Branch near Willow Springs School House between Sections Four (4) and Nine (9) Township Seventeen (17) North, Range Fourteen (14) East.

The bridge to consist of a Twenty Foot (20') Span, Twenty Four (24) Foot Roadway as shown on the plans to be built in accordance with the Oklahoma Standard Highway Specification as approved by the Bureau of Public Roads.

In the employment of labor innthe performance of this Contract, preference shall be given other conditions being equal, to honorably discharged soldiers, sailors and marines, but no other preference or discrimination among citizens of the United States shall be made.
