



MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE  
January 26, 1989

The Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, met at the hour of 9:00 a.m., with the following members present: John Selph, Chairman; Lewis Harris, Member. Members absent: Melvin C. Rice. Others present: Wayne Green, Caralee Adams, Wayne Carr, Herb Reed, Jim Helm, Dick Blakeley, Jeanette Bradley, Bob Gardner, Neal Kennedy, Marshall Stewart, Clayton Edwards, and Melody Bishop.

John Selph, Chairman, presiding, called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., and the following business was transacted:

Helm, Sheriff's office, stated the January 26 jail population is 532. The jail's capacity for adults has been further reduced by a recent increase in the number of juvenile males held in the jail. Reed stated there has been 3,060 prisoners released through the Pre-Trial Release Program over a period of months to avoid overcrowding in the jail. Harris asked Reed to include this information on his weekly reports to the Commissioners. Helm stated the jailers are analyzing the jail population and classifying prisoners as maximum, medium and minimum security risks. The Board asked Mr. Helm to attend the next management conference meeting.
