Cleveland that the sheriff be given aid as far as our power goes to assist him in enforcing the law. Motion prevailed. A motion prevailed that W.L. North be given authority to make arrangement with Vinita or elsewhere for Jail Room. Our motion Commissioners adjourned.

Tulsa, Oklahoma Jan. 6, 1908

The County Commissioners of Tulsa Co met in regular session in County Clerk's office all members being present. Minutes of last meeting read and by motion the following words were stricken from report. (A motion was made that the County Commissioners go into executive session Motion carried.) The minutes were then approved. The Petition of Ed W. Wall for appointment as Constable of Jenks Township ^{was read} and he was appointed Constable of said Township provided he complied with the law. The Bond of Ed W. Wall of Constable Jenks Township was on motion approved. The petition for Appointment of Chas H. Trace as Justice of the Peace for Jenks Township was read and he was appointed to said office provided he conforms with the law. The petitions of Henry Downing & D.B. Cooley were read and D.B. Cooley was appointed Constable of Owasso Township provided he conforms with the law. The Bond of H. J. Richardson Co. was examined and his bond on motion was approved. The Bond of Geo W. Wiles Clerk Bixby Township. M.M. Grace, Constable, Tulsa Township, N.J. Gules Co Judge, Noah G. Gregory, Clerk, Jenks Township, Joel D. Barnett Justice of the Peace Jenks Township. The Fidelity Abstract Co. Abstractors, Tulsa. Wm P. Briggs Constable, Lincolne Township. Joseph B. Simmons, Treasurer Jenks Township were all examined and on motion each were approved. The sealed bids for safes were opened and examined and the A. Schooley Stationery Co of Kansas City Mo being the best and lowest bid ^{was} given the order for four ^{heavy} ^{metal} ^{safe} Marvin Safes for County offices at a price of Three Hundred Twenty Five Dollars each subject to cancellation of order within ten days. W.L. North was elected chairman for term of one year. Commissioners took recess to meet at 8 A.M. Tuesday January 7th 1908.

Commissioners pursuant to agreement ^{met} on Tuesday Jan 8 at 8 A.M. all members present. The contract of the United States Authorities at Vinita for Jail was read and motion made to accept contract motion prevailed. The following contract was agreed upon.
