Among others, the following proceedings were had:

BEFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF TULSA COUNTY, OKLAHOMA.

PETITION TO CROSS SECTION LINES WITH STRIP OPERATIONS.

Comes now the Leavell Coal Company, a corporation, of the State of Oklahoma, and represents to your honorable Board of Commissioners of Tulsa County, that it is the owner of a tract of land near the Frisco Railroad right of way, in Section Twenty Eight (28), Township Twenty (20) Range Thirteen (13) East, in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, that the said company holds good and valuable leases upon more than three hundred (300) acres of land lying between the said lands on the Frisco Rail Road and extending north almost to the Santa Fe Tracks east of Mohawk, that the said company is opening up the said lands for the production of coal, with an expenditure of about three hundred thousand (\$300,000.00) Dollars building tripples, tracks, ponds and houses.

Your petitioner further states that because of operations of this mine the cost of fuel to the citizens of this county has been greatly reduced.

Your petitioner states that its coal lands are in Sections Twenty One (21), Twenty Two (22) and Twenty Eight, (28), Township Twenty North, Range Thirteen (13) East, and that it is necessary to the development of the said coal lands to cross and re-cross portions of the roads between these sections with its shovel, tracks and pits.

Your petitioner further states that should permission be granted by your Honorable Board to cross said road, the necessary steps will be taken to restore the said public road, and that while crossing, it will maintain a suitable detour so that traffic along said road shall not be interfered with.

WHEREFORE, the premises considered, your petitioner prays that your honorable Board grant your petitioner the ~~right~~ privilege and authority to cross and re-cross the said section lines under the conditions hereinbefore recited.

On this 21st day of February, 1921, comes on for hearing the application of the Leavell Coal Company for permission to carry on its coal mining operations across section lines between Sections Twenty One (21) and Twenty Two (22), in said Township Twenty (20) North, Range Thirteen (13) East, and between Sections twenty one and twenty eight (21 & 28) in said township Twenty (20) Range Thirteen (13), and the commissioners having heard evidence and being fully advised in the premises, find that the said petitioner should be granted upon the terms herein-after expressed.

It is further ordered that the Leavell Coal Company be permitted to cross and re-cross with its stripping operations in carrying on its coal mining business the section line between Sections Twenty One (21) and Twenty Two (22), and between sections Twenty One (21) and Twenty Eight (28), all in Township Twenty (20) north, Range Thirteen (13) east, provided that before said Leavell Coal Company may exercise its privilege hereby granted, it shall open up a public road as indicated in its petition filed herein.
