The filthy condition of the Court House should not require comment, as it is painfully apparent to any cleanly inclined person that the Janitor service is deficient and that the force is either entirely inadequate or possess a very far fetched idea as to what constitutes clenliness and common decency. The present prevailing idea seems to be that when certain areas of the building are swept every day or two, there the responsibility of the janitors cease until the next sweeping time. The floors, especially the hall floors and stairs, are dirty, the office furnishings are dust covered, the drinking fountain is generally in an unsanitary condition, the windows need but a casual glance to reveal the aspect of an ancient and long uninhabited building, the toilets are filthy and the odors emanating therefrom permeate the entire building and are a disgrace and an outrage against public decency, to say nothing of endangering the health of the occupants of the building.

If I should be permitted to recommend corrective measurers, I would say:

First: That a mop and water be liverally applied to the halls and stairs at least every other day, or every dat if it requires that to keep them clean and presentable.

SecondL: that the janitors be given instructions in the art of dusting, by some competent person, and that the dust cloth be used regularly after each sweeping.

Third: That the drinking fountain be washed thoroughly every day regularly.

Fourth: that the toilet furnishings first he put in a condition that they may be kept sanitary, either by feplacing the present ones with new ones, or by covering the ones now in use with a thick coat of white enamel; then that the tanitors be instructed to mop the floors and to wash the stools and seats daily.

Thes would purify the atmosphere of the building, sweeten our dispositions, give us more self respect, and put us in a better position to command the respect of the cotizens of W. F. Seaver, County Attorney.

Acting upon the above petition, a motion was made by F. M. Wooden and seconded by W. L. North that O. D. Lawson, County Clerk, be authorized to employ a temporary janitor, and place the Tulsa County Court House in a cleanly condition. Motion carried.
