R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, Section 5776 of the Compiled Statutes of Oklahoma, 1921, as amended by Section 1 of Chapter 65 of the Acts of the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma, 1925, provides that each County in the State of Oklahoma shall be divided by the Board of County Commissioners into three compact districts as equal in population as possible and numbered respectively one, two and three, and subject to alterations not more than once in three years.

AND, WHEREAS, the boundaries of the present Commissioners Districts of Tulsa County were fixed a number of years ago. And, whereas, since that time developments and population of said County has increased and thereby causing said Districts as they now exist to be out of proportion in population and development, and whereas, this Board
