was complimented on his fine work.

The County's insurance with Blue Cross/Blue Shield will end its first year on June 30, 1984. Mr. Tallent is presently seeking quotes on coverage and information is being compiled by the Personnel Department. Atlas Life has refused to quote on the coverage at this time. All claims should be turned into Blue Cross/Blue Shield on a timely basis.

Rice mentioned that he had received notice that Blue Cross/Blue Shield has been declared a non-profit organization by the Oklahoma Tax Commission.

The following items were discussed under any new business to come before the Board not known about at the time of the posting of the agenda.

Concerning the re-organization of the Park Department, an acceptable agreement between Personnel and Mr. Phillips has been reached. The Board concurred with the changes and Tallent will implement the plan.

The question of Pre-paid Legal Insurance has been forwarded to the office of the District Attorney for an opinion.

Several opinions are also pending on zoning questions.

Edwards is currently working on finding land for a new Army Reserve Center.

Edwards has compiled a report on the matter of providing uniforms to County employees. A policy needs to be developed in order that all departments provide the same benefits to County employees. Edwards and Rice will work on the development of the policy.

Rice will meet with Commissioner Gardner concerning the District Attorney's bogus check system.

Appointments for 1984 to various boards were discussed. Harris is to obtain possible appointments for the City-County Electrical Examining and Appeals Board. Rice is to check with INCOG regarding appointments to the Tulsa Community Action Agency. Rice is also to write all members of the Professional Services Selection Committee informing them that the Board will be dormant. Rice will also recommend appointments to the Hispanic Affairs Commission this month.

No action has been taken in the matter of reclassification of the Highway Department bookkeepers.

Edwards reported on the Collinsville Fire Protection District. A petition is being circulated now calling for an election on the question.

Data Processing is continuing to work on the Land Records Management System.

Susan Harris' appointment to the Excise/Equalization Board was discussed. The legality of her accepting the appointment while presently serving on the INCOG Board of Directors was questioned. David Carpenter is to provide an opinion as soon as possible. The Oklahoma Tax Commission's appointment to the Excise/Equalization Board will come from Commission District No. 1.

The Misdemeanant Work Program is progressing rapidly. The Felony Work Program is being checked out by Edwards. The latter program does not appear to be feasible at this time.

The problems with distribution of cheese and butter were discussed. Edwards reported on new eligibility requirements which will greatly increase the cost of the program to Tulsa County. Also, Edwards attributed the increasing problem of spoilage of the commodities to poor wrapping,
