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system be used, either by purchasing new equipment or by contracting to use the City of Tulsa's.

Harris noted that any plan that is put together for communications should include the Sheriff's office. Jordan was directed to prepare cost estimates, etc., and report back to the Board.

Jordan reported that the Safety Division has received notice to vacate its headquarters at Expo Square, and all supplies are being relocated to the Construction Division's new location on Highway 169. Jordan also noted that this relocation was only a short-term solution until January. Jordan is presently checking on several options, such as portable buildings, etc. The Chairman directed Jordan to develop a plan for a new building for the Safety Division, develop cost figures, etc., and prepare a report for the Board.

Harris noted the need to assign a name to the new facility on Highway 169. At the present time, there are several names being used.

Jordan also requested and was authorized by the Board to begin using waterbase paint for striping; existing equipment is to be converted during the winter and new specifications drawn up for the paint bid. Jordan explained that this conversion would eliminate several problems relating to storage of the paint, clean-up of equipment and fire safety.

The Chairman directed Edwards to work with Jordan on this matter.

Remodeling plans for Pre-Trial Release were discussed. Jordan has estimated the cost of labor and materials for the project to be approximately \$20,000. If the work is done in house, approximately forty to fifty percent of that cost would be eliminated. It was noted that Sheriff Glanz had said he would assist with the funding for this project.

Jordan explained to the Board that several other steps would have to be taken prior to the start of Pre-Trial's remodeling project. First, the Building Operations staff will have to be moved, followed by the offices staffed by Administrative Services in that area to be occupied by Pre-Trial. Rudd assured the Board that the work could be done by Building Operations if a logical progression of the remodeling was accomplished.

The Chairman directed Jordan, Edwards, Reed and Rudd to develop a schedule and costs for the remodeling, to work with Sheriff Glanz regarding his needs and possible funding for Pre-Trial, and to report back to the Board as soon as possible.

A request for retirement credit from Herb Reed was discussed. Rice noted that a precedent had been set in this area and that he would like to see the Board approve Reed's request.

Harris inquired as to what Reed's eleven years of credit would do to the retirement system's unfunded liability. He noted that Reed would have to deposit monies into the fund to equal his portion and the County's contributions.
