The following is a resolution passed by the Board of County Commissioners, at this meeting.

RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS,
OF TULSA COUNTY, OKLAHOMA.

It appearing to the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, from the last Federal Census of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, as shown by the Registration for way purposes that the County of Tulsa has a population of over sixty (60,000) thousand people.

It further appearing to the Board that the basis of salaries heretofore allowed County Officers in said County has been upon the census of showing Tulsa County to have a population of thirty four (34,000) thousand people.

It therefore appearing to the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, that the County officers of Tulsa County, are entitled to their compensation upon a basis of population as it now exists, and as shown by said last census, instead of the basis of population taken over seven years past, when the population of said County was less than one half as much as it is now.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by this Board upon motion of R.A. Martin and seconded by W.L. North and duly carried by the unanimous vote of said Board, that from and after the first day of July, 1917, said County officers of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, be paid upon the basis of population of over sixty (60,000) thousand people, and in the salaries as hereinafter enumerated and set out as follows, to-wit:

County Attorney.	\$3,000.00
Sheriff.	3,000.00
County Clerk.	3,000.00
County Treasurer.	3,000.00
County Assessor.	3,000.00
Cou S County Judge.	2400 = 3,000.00
Superior Judge.	3,000.00
County Superintendent.	1,800.00
County Commissioners.	800.00 each.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

In the matter of the increase of the salaries of certain deputies and assistants to the County Treasurer, County Clerk, Court Clerk, County Superintendent of Public Instruction, County Assessor, Sheriff of Tulsa County, and County Attorney.

IT APPEARING to the Board of County Commissioners at this adjourned meeting of regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners for the month of July, 1917, that due to the fact that the number and salaries of deputies and assistants to the County Treasurer, County Clerk, Court Clerk, County Superintendent of Public Instruction, County Assessor, and County Attorney, are now being allowed upon the basis of a population of thirty four (34,000) thousand in the
