February 2, 1914.

The Board of County Commissioners met in their rooms, at 10:30 o'clock A. M. All members present.

Moved by Mr. Baker and seconded by Mr. Woolley that Mr. Wm. Bevans be appointed Constable of District No. 9, Tulsa County. Motion prevailed.

Moved by Mr. Wooley and seconded by Mr. Baker that the following resolution be adopted and a copy sent to the State Board of Agriculture:

"RESOLVED, That all cattle shipped into Tulsa County, be dipped in accordance with the State Quarentine regulations, and that the State Board of Agriculture be requested to establish quarentine line around Tulsa County and to co-operate with Tulsa County in aradicating the fever tick." Motion prevailed.
