now owned by the Local Board of Control of the International Dry Farming Congress and Soil Products Exposition, situated upon the Southwest Ten acres (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of the northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southwest Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Thirty-two (32) Township Twenty (20) North, Range Thirteen (13) East, now owned by the Tulsa County and that tract of land immediately South of the above described tract containing about thirty (30) acres, now owned by the Tulsa County Fair Association; and also levy and collect an annual tax upon all the taxable property in said County, sufficient to pay the interest on such indebtedness as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof within 25 years from the time of contracting the same; such property, when acquired, to be used for exhibition and fair purposes.

Second: That a proclamation or notice of said election shall be and the same is hereby authorized to be ordered and given substantially in the following form, to-wit:

By virtue of the authority conferred by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Oklahoma, and pursuant to a resolution and order duly adopted and passed by the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, a regular adjourned session thereof held on the 11th day of Feby, 1914, public notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in said Tulsa County, on the 17th day of March, 1914, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said County, the following propositions:

Shall the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, be authorized to issue the negotiable coupon bonds of said county to the amount of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to provide for the purchase of the buildings now owned by the Local Board of Control of the International Dry Farming Congress and Soil Products Expositions, situated upon the Southeast Ten acres SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of the northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southwest Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section thirty-two (32) Township Twenty (20) North, Range Thirteen (13) East, now owned by Tulsa County, and that tract of land immediately south of the above described tract, containing about thirty (30) acres, now owned by the Tulsa County Fair Association, and also levy and collect an annual tax upon all the taxable property in said County, sufficient to pay the interest on such indebtedness as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof within 25 years from the time of contracting the same; such property, when acquired, to be used for exhibition and fair purposes. Yes No. An elector desiring to vote for the bond issue and tax levy shall stamp a cross (X) in the square in front of the word "YES", and an elector desiring to vote against the bond issue and tax levy, shall stamp a cross (X) in the front of the word "No". Said election will be held at the polling places designated by the County Election Board, for the holding of general election in said Tulsa County, the same being the usual places for holding elections therein, which places are as follows, to-wit:

The ballot to be used at said election will contain the proposition substantially in the form hereinbefore set forth.

The polls at said election will be opened at the hour of eight o'clock in the forenoon and closed at the hour of six o'clock in the afternoon of said election day, except that in the City of Tulsa, the polls will be opened at the hour of six o'clock in the forenoon and closed at the hour of seven o'clock in the afternoon.

The said election will be conducted in the manner prescribed by the General Election Laws of the State of Oklahoma, and all persons possessing the qualifications prescribed by said laws and by the Constitution of said State are entitled to vote at said election.

That said election proclamation and notice shall be and the same is hereby published in two weekly newspapers published at the County Seat of said County and of general circulation in said County, for four (4) consecutive calendar weeks, the first of said publications to be not less than thirty days prior to the date fixed for said election.

Third: That the ballots for said election shall set fourth the proposition to be voted upon substantially in the form hereinbefore given, and the same shall be prepared, the said election held and conducted, the votes cast thereafter counted, the results thereof returned, canvassed and certified as and in the manner prescribed by the General Election Laws of the State of Oklahoma:

Fourth: That this order and resolution, together with the proceedings of the Board relative thereto shall be published in the Tulsa Daily Democrat, a newspaper published and of general circulation in said Tulsa County.

Fifth: That the County Clerk be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Election Board of said County at the end of thirty days from its adoption and passage.

Sixth: That this resolution and order shall be in full force and effect thirty days after its adoption and passage.
