**MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE
NOVEMBER 14, 1996**

Chairman called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and determined there was not a quorum present. Therefore, the meeting was recessed until 11:30 a.m.

The meeting reconvened at 11:48 a.m., with the following members present: Robert N. Dick, Chairman; Lewis Harris. Member absent: John Selph. Others present: Sheriff Stanley Glanz, Jerry Griffin, Buck Rudd, Marshall Stewart, and Pam Hayes.

Chairman called the meeting to order at 11:48 a.m., and the following business was transacted:

Glanz advised that John Milosovich, Voorhis & Associates, Inc., will be in Tulsa to pre-inspect the jail on Monday, November 18, 1996 to determine if the deficiencies listed in the three reports by the Department of Justice (D.O.J.) have been corrected. He added that the D.O.J. is scheduled to inspect the jail December 11-13, 1996.

Dick said the COPS MORE 96 application had been deferred from a regular BOCC meeting for discussion at this management conference due to questions the commissioners wished to have answered. Harris said he had a preconference with Griffin and had asked him to provide current statistics regarding law enforcement in unincorporated areas of Tulsa County. Griffin distributed a Uniform Crime Report which compared 1990-1995 crime rates for this area. He said the better the officers know their community and know the people who work in their community, the lower the crime rate. This program will assist the deputies and investigators in becoming better acquainted with the unincorporated areas. If technology can be used to compile information, the data collected will be readily available even when officers are moved to different districts or different shifts. Griffin said the Tulsa Regional Dispatch Center had been asked to help develop a community policing code to help track information (number/type of call, time involved, location, etc.). He explained that use of the computer system which allows broadcast faxing/calling will enable the Sheriffs Office to keep in better contact with business owners by sending them monthly bulletins on crime tips, etc. Dick asked for a beat map showing where in the unincorporated areas officers are working. He also asked for reports at future Management Conference/Tulsa County Criminal Justice Authority meetings to provide updated information regarding how this program is focussing on the unincorporated areas of Tulsa County. Dick asked what the cost would be in subsequent years if the program could not be completed in one year. Griffin said the hardware is a one-time-only expense, and plans are to hire the secretary and criminal analyst as temporary employees for one year only. He added that an application could be submitted for up to three years with a 25%-75% split in matching funds, if more time is necessary. A motion was made by Harris, seconded by Dick, to approve the COPS MORE 96 application and authorize execution by the Chairman. Motion carried. (CMF #162046)
