The appointment of J. S. Shaver, as bailiff for the County Court was approved.

The affidavit of erroneous assessment filed by L. B. Ryal covering South Thirty-seven and one half (37½) acres in the Southeast quarter (SE¼) of the southwest quarter (SW¼) of section 18, township 18, range 13, was by the Board ordered stricken from record.

There was presented to the Board the application of the Marnett Mining Company, a corporation, for permission to construct certain gas lines in the County of Tulsa, State, of Oklahoma, which application was read by the Clerk to the Board whereupon the following resolution was made;

#### R E S O L U T I O N.

#### RESOLUTION.

This matter coming on for hearing this 6th day of June, A. D. 1921, upon the application of the Marnett Mining Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of West Virginia, with offices in the City of Bartlesville, Oklahoma, which has been qualified, authorized and permitted to transact business in the state of Oklahoma, and it appearing that said Marnett Mining Company is the owner of a series of pipelines in said State of Oklahoma and is doing an intrastate business therein and is entitled under house Bill No. 117 of the session of Laws of 1917, approved March 8th, 1917, to the use of public highways for the purpose of laying therein its pipelines, and it further appearing that said Marnett Mining Company has agreed in all things to comply with the orders of the County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma respecting the laying of said line and to obey the rules and regulations of the County Engineer and the State Highway Department.

IT IS THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED RESOLVED AND DECREED, that the said Marnett Mining Company shall have, and it is hereby given the right to lay its pipeline upon the public highway, to wit:

Beginning at a point on the range line dividing Ranges 12 and 13 at the center of section 12, township 22 north Range 12; thence south along said range line to a point being the southeast corner of section 13, township 22, range 12 in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, said line to be laid 20 feet east of the property line of said section 12 and 13 in Township 22, Range 12.
