Tulsa, Oklahoma, August 3, 1914.

Board of County Commissioners met in regular session in their rooms, Monday August 3, 1914, at nine o'clock A. M. Akk members present. Board proceeded to audit Claims against the County. (SeelClaims)

Upon motion, \$84.37 Eighty four dollars and thirty seven cents was agreed upon as the purchase price for a right of way for a road in Wekiwa Township, described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the west line of section 8 township 19 In re north, range 12 east, said point being 12 feet south of the center line of the Sand Springs railway, as now located and constructed; thence in a northeaster- por ly direction on a line paralell to and twelve feet south of said center line of the Sand Springs Railway, to the north line of said section eight. south fifty feet; thence southwesterly on a line paralell to said Sand Springs Railway to the west line of said section eight; thence north fifty feet to the place of beginning, containing .675 acres more or less and known as the Trimble property in the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 19 N. R. 12 E.

Upon motion \$150.00 was agreed upon for the fencing and \$401.25 for the land condemned as a right of way taken for a raad in Wekiwa Township and described as follows: Beginning at a point on the east line of Section Ten Township Nineteen, North, Range E., where said section line intersects the north right of way line of the M. K. & T Railroad as now located and constructed; thence in a northwesterly direction along said right of way line, a distance of 2850 feet to a point on the north line of the south-east quarter of said section Ten (10); thence east along said north line to a point 50 feet dissant, and at right angles to said M. K. & T. right of way line; thence in a southerly direction paralell to said right of way line, a distance of 2750 feet to a point on the East line of said section Ten; thence south along daid section line to the place of beginning, containing three and twenty-one one hundredth acres more or less and known as the John Hall property located in the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 10-19-11.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, met in regular meeting on this, the 3rd day of August, 1914, same being the first Monday in said month. There were present, Cyris S. Avery, Chairman, James Woolley, and Ed. Baker, being all the members of the Board of County Commissioners, with R. E. Currant, County Clerk, acting as secretary of the meeting.

Among r other proceedings, the following were had: Mr. Wooley introduced a resolution entitled A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF THE NEGOTIABLE COUPON BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF TULSA, STATE OF OKLAHOMA, TO THE AMOUNT OF \$14000.00, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING A LIKE AMOUNT OF THE LEGAL OUTSTANDING JUDGMENT INDEBTEDNESS OF SAID COUNTY: PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY OF AN ANNUAL TAX SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE INTEREST OF SAID BONDS WHEN DUE AND TO CONSTITUTE A SINK-ING FUND FOR THE DISCHARGE OF THE PRINCIPAL THEREOF AT MATURITY, AND FIXING THE OTHER DETAILS OF THE ISSUE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Which resolution was read in full by the County Clerk whereupon Mr. Baker moved that Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of said resolution be adopted as read.
