BEFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

In the Matter of the Complaint against Ceorge Snyder, Treas- urer of Jenks Town- ship, Tulsa County,

Action taken on petition for removal of George Snyder as Treasurer of Jenks Township.

Now on this the 6th day of October 1914, at the hour of two P.M., this matter comes on for hearing before this Board, complainant B. W. Cummings appearing in person and by his counsel, J. R. League, and the respondent, George Snyder, appearing in person and by his counsel, P.H. Maroney, upon the charge of vacancy and misconduct and malfeasance in office, and both sides announcing ready for trial, and the said George Snyder, respondent, entering a general denial and his plea of not guilty to the charges of misconduct and malfeasance in office.

And the Foard of County Commissioners being fully advised in the premises, hold that they have no jurisdiction to try and remove from office the said George Snyder upon the charges of misconduct and malfeasance in office.

The Board finds upon the stipulation and agreement with the parties hereto that the said George Snyder is, and has been for the past eight months preceding the filing of the complaint herein, a resident and an inhabitant of the Tuwn of Jenks, Tulsa County, Oklahoma; that the said Town of Jenks is an incorporated town, having a population of less than 1500 people according to the last census; and that the said incorporated town of Jenks is wholly within and surrounded by the territory of the township of Jenks, Tulsa County,

Whereupon, the matter being submitted to the Board of County Commissioners upon the above stipulated state of facts, for their consideration and decision, the Board does find that there is no vacancy in office of township treasurer of Jenks Township, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and declines and refuses to declare that there is a vacancy in said office, to all of which the complainant objects and excepts, and gives notice of an appeal to the District Court of said County from the decision of said Board, and the Board of County Commissioners fixes the amount of appeal bond in the sum of \$25.00, to be conditioned as provided by law, and approved by the County Clerk of said County.
