

FRIDAY, JULY 8th, 1921.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Tulsa, Oklahoma, met in the office of the County Clerk of the aforesaid county and state, pursuant to adjournment, with the following members present: George E. Gilmore, Chairman, F. M. Wooden and Ira Short, members, and O. D. Lawson, County Clerk, and Ex Officio, Secretary of the Board.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, who announced the Board ready to consider any business that might properly come before it, and the matter of the Farm and Home Economics Demonstrators was presented and considered. Whereupon it was moved by F. M. Wooden and seconded by Ira Short that the sum of \$5500.00 be the request of the Board of County Commissioners to the County Excise Board for the Farm and Home Demonstration work for the fiscal year 1921-22, and the vote thereon was as follows. F. M. Wooden "AYE" Ira Short "AYE" George E Gilmore "AYE" and said motion having received all of the votes of the said Board the same was by the Chairman declared carried.

A motion was made by F. M. Wooden and seconded by Ira Short that the sum of \$1440.00 be the request of the Board of County Commissioners of the County Excise Board for the City Home Demonstration Agent providing the City of Tulsa, or her organization through the Chamber of Commerce or by private donation, make a special appropriation to properly maintain the work. The vote on said motion being as follows:

W. Vincent, District Agent for and on behalf of the Extension Division.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR FARM AND HOME DEMONSTRATION WORK
between

BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF TULSA COUNTY, OKLAHOMA

This instrument, entered into this 8th day of July, 1921, is to witness that the County Commissioners agree to co-operate with the Extension Division of the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical College and the U. S. Department of Agriculture in conducting farm and home Demonstration work in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, during the year 1921-1922 under the following terms:

The County Commissioners agree to pay One Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$180.00) per month on the salary of an agent in charge of Farm Demonstration Work for a period of 12 months beginning July 1st, 1921. and

The County Commissioners agree to pay One Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$120.00) per month on the salary of the Home Demonstration Agent for a period of 12 months, beginning July 1st, 1921.

The County Commissioners agree further to put up the following amount per year to apply on the expense of the County Agent work as carried on in this County. Eight Hundred Dollars (\$800.00) and One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) including Ford Touring Car.

The Extension division of the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical College co-operating with the U. S. Department of Agriculture shall select the agents, and shall
