The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment in the office of the County Clerk of the County of Tulsa, Oklahoma, all members were present and the following proceedings were had.

WHEREAS, numerous complaints have been made by citizens and residents in the vicinity of the grounds used as a "dump" by the City of Tulsa, the same being in Section 3, Township 19, Range 12, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, that the stench created by, and arising from the use of said premises be said city as a place of dumping unsanitary refuses, is offensive and repugnant; that dead animals, including horses, dogs, cats, etc., are constantly and continuously being deposited upon said premises, and that the odor created thereby is most offensive, detrimental and injurious to the business and health of the citizens in that vicinity; that deposits from seepage from said premises is present in the water of that vicinity, and it is the opinion of the County Superintendent of Health that unless said conditions are immediately corrected and abated, the general health of the city will become greatly impaired, and that an epidemic of Typhoid is imminent by reason thereof;

Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS that the County Superintendent of Health and County Attorney be, and they are by these presents instructed to take such means as may be necessary or requisite to abate and correct the conditions in this resolution described, and that a copy hereof be placed before the Honorable Mayor and City Commissioners of the City of Tulsa, forthwith for their immediate consideration and action.
