and inspector who shall conduct said election, and the hours at which the poles shall be opened and closed.

## SECTION IV.

The ballot shall set out the proposition to be voted upon substantially as set out in Section One (1) hereof, and said election shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by the general election laws of said state for holding general elections.
