THURSDAY DECEMBER 17th, 1914.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, met in their room in regular adjourned session; all members present at 10 AM.

Upon Motion contract for doing Electrical Work on County Home for poor was awarded to the Electric Supply Company for the sum of One Hundred (\$180.00) Eighty, Dollars.

Total cost of building, plumbing, electrical work as noted amounts to Seven Thousand Two Hundred (\$7289.00) and Eightynine Dollars.

Upon Motion the petition of the Gulf Pipe Line Company was approved for the construction of pipe lines, telephones and telegraph lines over, under, across and along the public highways of Tulsa County, Oklahoma. (See petition and order on file in the office of County Clerk).

Resolution, Gulf Pipe Line Co.

Upon Motion the following resolution was adopted, to-wit:

"Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners, this 17th, day of December, 1914, that in consideration that the City shall build a brick paving 14 feet wide between curb stones over and along Factory Street, Main Street, and Mitchell Avenue in West Tulsa, that upon the completion of the brick roadway 14 feet wide, by the City of Tulsa, that the county of Tulsa will complete to grade a space of seven (7) feet on the outside of each side of said pavement for the entire distance excepting the railway right of way, and where necessary mix with slade the graded surface of this above mentioned strip, and will oil the same with road oil and cut the necessary ditches for grainage.
