Sealed Bids from Standard Paving Company, Layman & Sons, Contractors and Wood-Davis-Foster were received for the furnishing of necessary work to be done for grading and drainage of 1.25 miles of road on West 21st - Project 2-N. Upon the recommendation of Hugh Webster, Assistant County Attorney, a motion was made by Commissioner Couch, seconded by Commissioner Bailey, that these Bids be rejected unopened, and that they be returned to the respective Bidders. Upon roll call, the motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Couch, seconded by Commissioner Bailey, that the resignation of Ed E Berry, Constable in District 4, Division 2, Tulsa County, be accepted, and that Alton McKnight be, and he is hereby appointed to fill the vacancy; also that the Bond filed by Alton McKnight in the amount of \$1,000.00 and made by the Western Surety Company, be and the same is hereby approved. Upon roll call motion carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Couch, that the present Board meet on Tuesday Morning, January 2, 1951, at 10:00 o'clock a.m. and turn the meeting over to the new Board at that time. Motion died for want of a second.

Motion made by Commissioner Bailey, seconded by Commissioner Couch, and unanimously carried, that the present Board return on Monday morning, January 1, 1951, at 10:00 o'clock, together with Mr. Stokes County Clerk and Secretary to the Board and Mrs. Borton, Deputy County Clerk, and the newley elected officials come in to be sworn in at that time. Also that all of the employees time ceases on December 31, 1950 and the salaries of incoming employees to start on Tuesday morning January 2, 1951.

Motion made by Commissioner Bailey, seconded by Commissioner Hardesty, that the first above motion be, and the same is to be reconsidered. Upon roll call motion carried.
