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MONDAY, December 10th. 1923.

Pursuant to adjournment, the Board of County Commissioners met in their office, with all members present: Ed W. Hedgecock, Chairman, W. L. North and J. S. Shaver, Members. O. G. Weaver, County Clerk, Ex Officio Secretary.

The matter of opening Bids, and awarding contracts on the Tubercular Hospital and Refrigeration Plant at the Tulsa County Farm was taken up. After the opening of the ten bids submitted, it was found that the firm of BRICKNER - GARBETT COMPANY was the lowest and best bidder for the work, and accordingly, upon motion of W. L. North, seconded by J. S. Shaver, the award was made to BRICKNER - GARBETT COMPANY upon their bid of Thirty One Thousand, Two Hundred Seven Dollars (\$31,207). All members voting in the affirmative, motion was declared carried.

Three bids were submitted for the furnishing and installation of machinery and equipment in the Cold Storage Plant. Upon Motion of W. L. North, seconded by J. S. Shaver, the bid of UNITED IRON WORKS, Inc. was accepted and award made upon an amount of Eight Thousand Five Hundred Eighteen Dollars (\$8518.00). All members voting in the affirmative motion was declared carried.

Motion was made by W. L. North, seconded by J. S. Shaver, that the bid of PILSBURY-BECKER ENGR. CO. be and the same is hereby rejected for the reason that same was not accompanied by certified check. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Ed W. Hedgecock, seconded by J. S. Shaver, that the County Engineer be instructed to advertise for bids for a new concrete floor on (Rogers) Bird Creek Bridge. Bids to be considered December 17th. 1923. Upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, same was declared carried.
