R E S O L U T I O N

MARKET PRICE TO THE TULSA FEED COMPANY FOR EQUAL AMOUNT
OF FEED.

WHEREAS, Tulsa County has this day Thirty head of hogs that is not needed,
and

WHEREAS, it is to the best interests of Tulsa County Farm that the same
be disposed of, and

WHEREAS, Tulsa County Farm is in need of feed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners that
the Superintendent of Tulsa County Farm be authorized to trade Thirty head of hogs to the Tulsa
Tulsa Feed Company for the equal amount of feed; said hogs to be traded at the pre-
vailing market price of hogs.
