Bonds for bridge

A Committee composed of many of the most prominent members of the Tulsa Commercial Club and the Tulsa Boosters called on the Board of County Commissioners and Mr. G.N. Wright, Pres. of the Commercial Club, acted as spokesman and presented Ark River before the Commissioners the matter of the immediate need of calling an election for the purpose of voting on the question of issuing bonds to provide for the construction of the bridge across the Arkansas River, all the members of the delegation being heartily in accord with the proposition as presented by Mr. Wright.

> It being late the meeting adjourned to 1:30 P.M. when consideration of the proposition would be fully taken up.

Bridge Bonds

At 1:30 P.M. the meeting reconvened and the following is a copy of the action taken on County Bridge Bonds. "Minutes of meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, held on the 13th day of March, 1915, at the office of the County Clerk, in the City of Tulsa, the same being an adjourned session: Present: Cyrus S. Avery, Chairman, Ed. Baker, Member, Lewis Cline, Co. Clerk, Absent: A.W.Lucas. The Board med to consider the advisability of issuing bonds of said County for the purpose of building a bridge across the Arkansas River at or near the City of Tulsa, and after a thorough discussion of the matter, Comm. Ed. Baker introduced a Resolution and Order in words and figures as follows: RESOLUTION AND ORDER.

"Be It Resolved, that the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, deem it advisable to issue bonds of said county in the aggregate principal sum of Two Hundred Thousand (\$200,000.00) Dollars, bearing interest at the rate of five percent per annum, payable semi-annually, the purpose for which the money derived from the sale of said bonds to be used in constructing a bridge across the Arkansas River at or near the City of Tulsa, in sad County, said bonds are to run from five years to twenty years from their date.

Said bridge to be known and designated as Bridge No. 33 and to be locat+ ed across the Arkansas River and described as follows; towit, Beginning at a point on the north bank of said river approximately south Eleven Deg. No minutes West, a distance of 1330 feet more or less, from the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of Section No.11, Township 19 North, Range 12 east, Tulsa County, Oklahoma; running thence approximately south 39 deg.30 min. west, a distance of 1400 feet, more or less, to the south bank of said river.

That the election therefor shall be held on the 12th day of April, 1915, and the polls shall be opened at seven o'clock A.M. and closed at six o'clock P.M. and the names of the Judges and Clerks for each voting precinct shall be as follows:
