It was ordered that the County Eng'r be instructed to direct the overseer of Wekiwa Twp. to construct a woven wire fence along the Wekiwa-Sand Springs road near the M.K.& T. Ry.

Instructions to Co. Eng'r

It was ordered that the Co. Eng'r see that Ditch No. 1 in Drainage District No. 2 be cleaned out and repaired.

It was ordered that the Co. Eng'r have constructed a five Ft. culvert one-half mile south of Bridge #119, between Sec.'s No.'s 19 and 20, Twp.18,R.14.

The sample form for Road Dragging Claim submitted by Co. Eng'r was approved. The plat of Survey for proposed changes in the Tulsa-Sapulpa road was considered and the matter carried over for further consideration at a later meeting.

The following Resolution for the Care and Control of Public Roads of Tulsa County was passed by the Commissioners:

RESOLUTION

"Whereas, Sec. 2759, Rev. Laws of Okla. provides for the obstructing of public highways, and

Whereas, thereare many pipe lines nor crossing and obstructing such highways, and

Care of Public Highways

Lines

Whereas, many others are beinglaid on and across such highways,
Now, in order to better care for and preserve the public highways of this
county, it is hereby resolved that no person or persons, company or corporation,
sall run, lay, place, or remove any pipe lines on, under, or across any of the
public highways of Tulsa County without first filing a written request to do
same with the County Commissioners setting forth the place and the time for so
placing same, and obtaining from the County Commissioners a permit to so place
same.

That, in laying and placing or removing any pipe line on, under or across any part of the said public highways of Tulsa County, the same shall be done after such permit has been given by said County Commissioners, and not otherwise, and shall be so placed under the supervision of the County Engineer, and a written report of same shall be filed with the County Commissioners showing when, where and how same has been done, and by whom.

And it is further resolved, that all existing pipe lines on or across any highway shall be buried after first obtaining the necessary permission.

That, any violation of this resolution shall be deemed a violation of the above named provision of the statute, and any person or persons, company or corporation violating these requirements to be duly presecuted under the above mentioned statute.

Approved and adopted this 13th day of March, 1915."

The matter of filing cases for the Court House was taken up and the contract was given to the Mayo Furniture Co. at \$675. to be in accordance with the specifications and Globe Wernecke standard grade.

Mr. J.C.Letcher, Secretary of the Tulsa Commercial Club appeared before the Board of County Commissioners and requested that the County assist in meeting the expense incurred in defeating the Campbell Russell bill so greatly to the detriment of Tulsa County and which would have deprived the County of a large amount of taxes which it at present receives. Upon consideration, the Board agreed to proportion out of the Contingent Fund, the sum of \$250.00 which amount the Commercial Club represented they had expended together with other moneys for the above purpose.
