

## CONTRACT OF SALE WITH THE HARVEY YOUNG OIL COMPANY.

Tulsa, Oklahoma, October 3rd, 1921.

Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa, Oklahoma, (hereinafter called the buyer) hereby buys and agrees to receive from the Harvey Young Oil Company, an Oklahoma corporation, (hereinafter called the seller) and the seller sells and agrees to deliver to the buyer at the price and in the quantity and upon the terms and conditions herein after specified, the following petroleum products.

PRODUCT: 24-26 gravity fuel oil.

QUANTITY: Requirements of the buyer for use in Tulsa County, Oklahoma.

PRICE: \$1.10 per barrel based on the present Prairie posted price of Mid Continent crude oil of \$1.00 per barrel, said base price to take 75% advance or decline of said crude oil price \$1.00 however shall be the minimum price on this contract no matter how low crude may go.

TERMS: Cash on presentation of invoices.

SHIPMENT: To be delivered by the seller to the buyers tanks,

REMARKS: This contract to cover period Oct. 3rd, 1921 to June 1st, 1922.

If the buyer fail to comply with ther terms of this contract the seller may defer further shipments of products until the terms of the contract are complied with or it may cancel this contract at its option.

The seller may also decline to make deliveries of products under this contract except for cash payable upon such delivery wherever the seller for any reason shall have any doubt as to the buyers financial responsibility and so advises the buyer thereof, whereupon the buyer shall have the privilege of satisfying the seller of his financial responsibility and when the seller is so satisfied, deliveries shall be made hereunder according to the terms above expressed.

Fires, accidents and strikes in the works of either the buyer or seller or on any transportation lines rendering the buyer unable to receive or seller unable to deliver, may make this contract inoperative during the time necessary in which to make repairs or during the continuance of such disability.

The products above specified are sold to the buyer for consumption at his own plant.
