Roberts for the jail \$100.00, for the clinic \$100.00, and for his office \$150.00. To Dr. J. H. Barham \$300.00; Dr. R. W. Motley \$75.00 and to Dr. Gifford H. Henry \$15.00. To the out-of-town drug stores, the following amounts: Red Fork \$30.00; Sperry \$25.00; Skiatook \$10.00; Dr. Smith \$50.00; Sand Springs \$25.00; Collinsville \$80.00; Bixby \$80.00; Broken Arrow \$60.00 and Jenks \$35.00.
