Proclamation.

It appearing to the undersigned Governor of the State of Oklahoma, that an Election duly called, was legally held in Tulsa County, in the State of Oklahoma, on October 19th, 1909, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said County, the following question, to wit:

"Shall Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, accept the herein described territory: All of Township seventeen (17) north, Range fourteen (14) East, and the northwest quarter of Township sixteen (16) North, Range fourteen (14) East, comprising sections four (4), five (5), six (6), seven (7), eight (8), nine (9), sixteen (16), seventeen (17) and eighteen (18) of said Township, now a part of Wagoner County, State of Oklahoma."

And the Board of Election Commissioners of said Tulsa County, as the Board of Canvassers of said election, having on October 21st, 1909, certified and returned said vote to me as Governor aforesaid, and it appearing from their said Certificate and return that a majority of the votes cast at said election was in favor of accepting said territory.

Now, Therefore, I Charles N. Haskell, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, agreeably to the provisions of Section 1, of Article 1, Chapter 26 of the Session Laws of the State of Oklahoma, 1907-1908, and as directed therein, hereby declare and proclaim for and upon behalf of the State of Oklahoma, that the territory herein before described has been legally transferred from said Wagoner County, in the State of Oklahoma to Tulsa County, in said State, and the will of the election is hereby ordered to be carried into effect. In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand as Governor of the State of Oklahoma, and caused the Great Seal of the State to be hereunto affixed.

Done at the city of Guthrie on this 29th Day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, nine hundred and nine.
