

COMMISSIONERS JOURNAL, TULSA COUNTY, OKLA.

Monday July 19, 1915

The Board of County Commissioners met in their rooms in the Court House, in their resolution session, Monday July 19, 1915, present A. W. Lucas, Ed. Baker, Lewis Cline, Clerk, absent, Cyrus S. Avery.

All claims were passed until regular meeting in August.

Motion was made by A. W. Lucas and seconded by Ed. Baker, that Charles I. Root buy 12-inch plows when needed for the different townships, for roadwork.

Motion was made by Ed. Baker and seconded by A. W. Lucas, that Charles I. Root order one six horse Adams grader for trial, after which is same proved satisfactory the Board of Commissioners would buy same.

Motion was made by A. W. Lucas and seconded by Ed. Baker, that Anna V. Swift, Matron at the County Home, be given authority to employ one girl as assistant at the County Home, at a salary not to exceed \$30.00 per month. Motion carried.

A motion was made that a parcel of ground containing two acres be set aside at the County Home as a garden and orchard, same to be managed by Anna V. Swift, while she is retained as matron of the Home.

Motion was made by A. W. Lucas and seconded by Ed. Baker, that all claims for road work, or material bought for Tulsa County, be properly sworn to and that all acknowledged, or two witnesses sign same, and to have O.K. of the purchaser, or the man in charge of the work, before it is allowed.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned, to meet at the regular meeting, Monday, August 2nd, 1915.

Monday, August 2nd, 1915.

The Board of County Commissioners met in their Rooms in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, on Monday the 2nd day of August, 1915, at 9 o'clock A. M. Present:- Ed Baker, A. W. Lucas, and Lewis Cline, Clerk, Absent: C. S. Avery.

No claims allowed. On account of the Excise Board not being able to make their levy the Commissioners could not allow any claims. All bills being held over until our regular meeting September 7th.

Receipts required of all officers. Motion was made by A. W. Lucas and seconded by Ed Baker, that each County Officer who buys stamps and is compelled to pay cash for any material used in his office, must take a receipt for same, and file same with his bill of Expenses. Motion carried.

Road opened. Motion was made by Ed Baker and seconded by A. W. Lucas that the section line between the East half of Sections Twenty three (23) and Twenty six (26) in Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Twelve (12) East, be opened and the same graded for use of the public. Motion carried.

Complaint of road. A complaint was made by Chas Brown as to the condition of the road between sections twenty three (23) and thirty (30) in Township Twenty (20) North, Range Twelve (12) East, and the Board was asked to investigate said road and that it be graded so it could be used by the public.

Overseers OK for all Roadwork. A motion was made by A. W. Lucas and seconded by Ed Baker that all road claims after having been made up by the County Engineer from time sheets furnished him by the different Road Overseers and OK'ed by R. K. Hughes, County Engineer, that said claims have the OK of the Township Road Overseer, that said claims must be signed by the party in whose favor it is drawn and his signature witnessed by two reliable persons or acknowledged by a Notary Public, which will make the claim a competent claim for the County Commissioners to accept and issue a warrant for against the Road fund of Tulsa County. Motion carried.

A.M. Welch employed for Poor. A motion was made by Ed Baker and seconded by A. W. Lucas, that A. M. Welch be employed at a salary of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per month as Superintendent of the Poor. Motion carried.

Damage claim of J.H.Adams (Colored). The claim of J. H. Adams (Colored) for \$3,250.00 damages, for his leg being broken, while at work for Joseph Lantry in Wekiwa Township, excavating, was disallowed.

A motion was made by A. W. Lucas and seconded by Ed Baker that J. H. Adams (Colored) be allowed a salary of two dollars (\$2.00) per day until he is able to perform daily labor and the County Physician was instructed to administer to all of his needs until his broken leg was healed. Motion carried.
