specified public highways of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the said gas pipe lines shall be so buried as not to interfere with the ingress and egress of adjadent farmers at ordinary places of entrance to their lands, and at such other places where the abutting land owners may desire to locate a place of entrance to their lands, when so requested by the owners.

IT IS UNDERSTOOD that in granting this order it shall in nowise be construct as assuming any responsibility on the part of the Board of County Commissioners of said county, or on the part of said county, for any damage arising from the putting down, construction and operation of said line, but the CONSOLIDATED GAS COLPANY, Ltd. shall be responsible for all damages accruing from the construction of said gas pipe line, or which in any ways may be caused or occasioned thereby, or by the use and maintenance of the same.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED, that this order and the rights accruecd thereunder and granted hereby shall in no wise abridge the right or authority of the Commissioners, the Township Trustees, and Road Overseers of the public highways in said County as the same is now provided by law.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that said pipe line shall be used, made and constructed as not to interfere with the use of said public highways nor the repair thereof, now with the drainage of the highways, and in crossing streams and drains shall be placed wither above or below the same so as not to obstruct the flow of water therein, and when placed under the surface of said highways the surface orroadbed thereof shall be restored to the same degree of safety for travel as the same was before said pipe was put under the surface thereof.
