

Tuesday, October 25th, 1921.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma, met in the office of the County Clerk, pursuant to adjournment, with all members present, the following proceedings were had.

A motion was made by F. M. Wooden and seconded by Ira Short that the copy of the opinion of the Attorney General with reference to the matter of certain officials of a town operating under a charter form of government, also holding a position of Deputy Court Clerk, and obtaining compensation for services in both instances, be incorporated in the minutes of this meeting. Motion carried. The same being as follows, to-wit:-

Dear Sir:-

This department is in receipt of your letter of recent date asking for a ruling on the following:

1. 'Can a member of the Board of Commissioners under a charter form of government, and who is obtaining compensation for his services as such commissioner, also hold the position of Deputy Court Clerk, and draw compensation therefor.'
2. 'Can a person appointed and acting as the Clerk of a city operating under a charter, and who is drawing compensation for his services, also hold the position as deputy Court Clerk and obtain compensation therefor.'

It is the opinion of the Attorney General that each of these two questions should be answered in the negative.

A motion was made by F. M. Wooden and seconded by Ira Short that John Ghormley be appointed Constable to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of A. W. Watkins, District No. 4, Tulsa. Motion carried.

A motion was made by F. M. Wooden and seconded by George E. Gilmore that the resignation of J. L. Winsell; as constable within and for district No. 11, Sand Springs be and the same is hereby accepted. this 25th day of October, 1921. Motion Carried.

Motion to adjourn to next regular meeting seconded by Ira Short.
