The application of the OKLAHOMA NATURAL GAS COMPANY was the first matter coming on for hearing, and after consideration of said application, the following order was made:

BEFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS,
TULSA COUNTY, STATE OF OKLAHOMA.

IN RE Application of Oklahoma Natrual Gas Company, a corporation of Tulsa, Oklahoma, to construct pipe lines along and under public highways of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit:

Beginning at a point at the center of the east and west section line road between sections 17 and 20, Township 16 North, Range 13 East, being the division line between Tulsa and Okmulgee Counties, Okla., thence running North to a point near the Northwest corner of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Sec. 5, Township 16 North, Range 13 East, crossing the east and west section lines between sections 20 and 17 (from center of road) and between Sections 17 and 8, and between Sections 8 and 5, All in Township 16 North, Range 13 East, to be known as Line "A-127", a 4" gas pipe line, Tulsa County, Oklahoma.

NOW, On this 21st. day of January, A.D. 1924, at a regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, held in compliance with and according to law, the application of OKLAHOMA NATURAL GAS COMPANY, a Corporation of Tulsa, Oklahoma, for the right to put down, construct, and operate its four inch
