MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE
December 12, 1991

The Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County met at the hour of 9:00 a.m., with the following members present: Lewis Harris, Chairman; John Selph, Robert N. Dick. Members absent: None. Others present: Stanley Glanz, Bill Thompson, Buck Rudd, Manny Gamallo, Clay Edwards, Vera Carroll.

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m., and the following business was transacted:

Glanz and Thompson discussed problems experienced with jail inmates, particularly the intentional setting of a fire recently following inmate fighting. Thompson stated the fire was quickly extinguished and if it can be determined who was responsible, charges would be filed against that person as a deterrent to future intentional fire-setting by inmates.

Glanz said he has considered the banning of smoking in the jail although he knows it will initially create difficulties.

Glanz reported he has not received a response to a letter he sent to the Mayor several weeks ago regarding formation of a jail management committee. Harris said he will check on this with the Mayor.

Glanz reported the jail population count is around 600 and with the help of the Pre-trial and Community Service Work programs he believes he can maintain that level.
