Actual available balance to spend

\$2,000.

The manner in which the system is being operates now one cannot tell the amount of unpaid and outstanding liabilities against an approproation, nor can this information be available June 30, 1924.

The experience of this Board with unpaid claims of the fiscal year of 1922-23 is sufficient to cause you to heed this warning and protect the fund from getting in the condition it was at the close of the prior fiscal year.

All you need to do is to insist that no purchases be made withoutan order and that no order be issued unless a requisition is on file in the Clerk's office and that no claim for supplies be allowed and paid in the absence of the purchase order attached to the claim.
